2. Crime issues of particular note

The following list shows some of the crimes that have occurred in the previous month in your area.

- **5 reports of vehicle related crime during May, slightly down from last month's figures.**
- **2 business burglaries last month, one of which was an attempt whereby 3 persons are captured on CCTV at the location, Beswick, having attempted to gain entry to the Nursery within the grounds via a rear door, also an attempt made on the workshop damage caused to the lock, no entry was gained and nothing was stolen.**

New Rural Crime Officers Trained



21 police officers received Wildlife Crime training in a push to be a lead Force in the fight against rural crime.

The training took place 29 April – 3 May, increasing the number of trained Wildlife Crime Officers to 60. PCSOs and volunteers completed the course at Clough Rd. Alongside them were 2 CPS Prosecutors from the Humber area and southern counties.

The Force has now held three National Wildlife Crime courses over the past three years delivered by Craig Fellows. Craig is an expert in the field and delivers the training across the UK.

With 60 officers having completed the course we have one of the highest numbers of staff trained, if not the highest in England and Wales.

The course was organised by the Force Wildlife & Rural Crime officer PC Brandon Ward from the Community Safety Unit, with support in funding the course being provided by CI Paul Kirby from Learning & Development. Various partner agencies gave input to the course including Natural England, RSPB, BASC, RSPCA and the Bat Conservation Trust to name just a few.

Brandon said, “Humbeside Police is fast becoming one of the lead forces in the area of wildlife crime within the UK.

“Investing in staff in this complex area of policing is one of the main ways forward to protect our rural communities and wildlife.

“Having 60 staff trained, who are prepared to go that extra mile to protect our valuable wildlife for future generations, is a strong sign of our continued commitment to our rural communities.”

6. Useful information

Importance of reporting incidents/crimes

Just a reminder that it is really important you report any crimes or suspicious incidents to us. This can be either via 999 or the 101 phone number, via our web site, or personally at a police station or to an officer in the street. Only by reporting the crime/incident can we be aware of it. Once we are aware we may not be able to do anything about it immediately but the report will form part of a wider picture which helps inform where we direct officers to patrol and focus activity. So please take the time to report a crime/incident in the knowledge your time is not wasted.

The Neighbourhood Policing Team meet regularly with partners to ensure we have a multi-agency approach to local issues, individuals and problem solving. These meetings are regularly attended by partners including Humberside Fire and Rescue Service, Youth and Family Support, Housing Officers, Environmental Health and the East Riding Anti-Social Behaviour Team. We share information and resources to deal with local neighbourhood issues, in particular, those identified as causing the most harm in the community.
