2. Crime issues of particular note

The following list shows some of the crimes that have occurred in the previous month in your area.

- A high number of shop theft across both wards last month, some of which, investigations are still ongoing. During June our community patrols will continue to deliver high visibility reassurance in an attempt to deter shop thefts. Any intelligence re this issue can be submitted by calling Crime Stoppers 0800 555 111 or Humberside Police 101.
- 4 reported cases of residential burglaries across both Wards during May. Please remember to lock and secure all outbuildings and if possible use security lighting/alarms where possible.
- At least 29 reported cases of vehicle relate crime during May. During June our community patrols will continue to deliver high visibility reassurance in an attempt to deter vehicle crime.

3. Community Priorities

- **Humber talking** We have been pounding the streets twice weekly to survey hundreds of homes in the area to find out what your thoughts are on what you think we should be concentrating our efforts on. I am sure the final results will make interesting reading and will undoubtedly shape what we do in your area in the future. - The majority of incidents we attend as a Neighbourhood Team are categorised as **Anti-social behaviour (ASB)** This can be further split into Nuisance, Personal and Environmental. As the largest area of our business this will be a priority. We will continue to engage the public and attend incidents and situations that need to be addressed, this could be anything from nuisance youths to behaviour that falls short of being a crime.

8. Useful information

Spring is finally here, time to get into the garden or a visit to the allotment. Here is some practical, simple advice to beat the Garden Thief/Shed Burglar:

SHEDUCATION

Secure the access to your shed or garage by locking gates and using thorny bushes next to walls and fences.

Have you visibly marked the contents of your shed? Make a note of serial numbers and photograph valuable plants and ornaments.

External security lights which are activated by movement are a useful deterrent.

Doors of sheds require attention. Use strong hasp/staples and close shackled padlocks. Up and over garage doors supplied with standard lock fittings should also be fitted with a padlock or lockable bolt. Windows should be secured with locks or grilles.

Use coach bolts or non-return screws to secure door hinges.

Chain cycles, mowers, ladders and tools to a strong anchorage point.

Alarms for sheds and garages are available for under £20 at most DIY stores, catalogue shops and builders merchants.

Together we'll crack crime. Join a home watch scheme.

Exactly what insurance cover do you have? Check that your household policy covers you for theft from your garden and outbuildings.

Burglaries of sheds and garages are growing! The police together with Neighbourhood Watch Groups are asking for your help. The value of property in sheds and garages is more than people think. Thieves are targeting them for power tools, cycle and sports equipment. Hand tools are stolen and used to break into homes. So let's weed out these thieves by getting some ***sheducation!***
