11/25/67 APOLOGIES

11/25/68 DECLARATION OF INTERESTS

RESOLVED:

- a) that Cllr Baker declared an interest in the Tennis Club;

11/25/69 MINUTES

RESOLVED:

- a) that the minutes of the meeting held on 7 October 2025 be confirmed and signed by the Chair.

11/25/70 ACTIONS

The pond tree works would be undertaken in November 2025 and it was suggested that fallen trees near Malton Road also be chipped at the same time. It was hoped that these chippings could be utilised on the Nature Trail.

RESOLVED: that all Actions had been completed.

11/25/71 EAST RIDING COUNTY COUNCIL MATTERS

Graham Stuart, MP, Village Surgery

A surgery had been held and the main issues raised had been regarding traffic and the Risby Homes development. The presence of heavy goods vehicles (HGV) travelling through the village was unwanted. Parishioners had expressed the desire for speed bumps but had been unsure of where they would like them placed.

Bishop Burton Road maintenance

The vegetation was encroaching onto the road and as such the road would be closed to re-expand. Going out of the village there was cable ducting and subsequently there was no ability to re-expand the road to the right. There was potential to create a footpath on the left-hand side of the road with landowners' permission. This would be supported by the local authority LA and Bishop Burton Parish Council. Correspondence had been received requesting the speed be reduced to 30 mile per hour (mph) for the safety of pedestrians, particularly those using the bus service from Bishop Burton. The Chair would look to speak with Bishop Burton College regarding the creation of a footpath.

The speed of the road was currently 60 mph, however there had more recently been SLOW signs placed and white centring lines to assist with road safety, indicating that 60mph was not appropriate. The Parish Council would like to have the complete stretch of road changed to 30 mph. It was suggested a speed camera may be useful. Cllrs discussed that the X46 bus service coming through the village would be of benefit. Cllr Stewart would raise this at the Enhanced Bus Partnership Forum.

Canada Drive to Hudson Way footpath

The update was received.

Risby Homes

A letter had been sent to residents explaining that the access from Malton Road was temporary. Risby Homes would ensure greater communication with the Parish Council moving forwards.

Traffic

PC Leo Hammond had met with the Parish Council to discuss ANPR cameras. A Community Traffic meeting would be held on the 28 November 2025 at 7.00pm, this would be publicised on the Facebook page, the Notice Board and leaflets were being posted through doors. Leanne Darbison, Streetscene, would be invited to attend along with Graham Stuart, MP. Chicanes were discussed but had been deemed to be ineffective. PC Leo Hammond had explained that ANPR cameras and Speedwatch were the most effective methods. A decision would not be made by East Riding of Yorkshire Council (ERYC) at the meeting; however, this would allow direct conversation with parishioners. It was discussed that having white gates at the entrance of the village was a proven speed deterrent and that 'dragons' teeth' could be painted on as a cost-effective method. It was raised that Cherry Burton was low down on the ERYC priority list for road safety as there had been no significant incidents. Councillors discussed that the meeting would not be Parish Council run and was between the LA and parishioners. The Parish Council would look to present the options that they were able to move forwards with at the meeting. Cllr Wilcox would Chair the meeting. The need to share speed survey data with parishioners was raised, however it was noted that feedback had not always been received. The survey data from Safer Roads Humber would be requested.

RESOLVED:

- a) that the data presented by PC Leo Hammond be provided in writing for presentation at the Community Traffic meeting;

11/25/72 CORRESPONDENCE RECEIVED

Objection to bench at 68 The Meadows

A parishioner had raised a complaint regarding the siting of a bench on The Meadows. However, the request had now been withdrawn by the family. Cllrs removed permission for a bench at this site.

Operation Dark Night

Parish councillors wished to share this information with parishioners to ensure safety of cyclists and walkers now the dark nights had drawn in. A post would be shared on Facebook.

East Riding Enhanced Bus Partnership Forum

Cllr Stewart would attend.

b) that a rough sleeping evaluation be undertaken 6 November 2025;
c) that Operation Dark Night be shared on Facebook;
d) that Cllr Stewart attend the Enhanced Bus Partnership Forum.

11/25/73 VILLAGE SURVEY

The LA had contested that a hedge was the property of the Parish Council, however the Parish Council disputed this. This had been returned to the LA as their responsibility. The Parish Council would monitor the situation and ensure the hedge was tended to before spring 2026.

The ash die back had been assessed and deemed to be acceptable at this moment in time. Cllrs queried whether this would be monitored annually. Cllrs would monitor this whilst undertaking the Streetscene assessment, but did raise concerns that ash die back could progress quickly. It was requested that Streetscene respond to all raised items. Cllrs wished to share the Streetscene successes with parishioners on the website.

RESOLVED: a) that the ash die back be monitored annually;
b) that Streetscene be requested to respond to all raised items;
c) that the Streetscene success be shared with parishioners.

11/25/74 BUS SHELTER

Cllrs were pleased to have received confirmation of funding for a new bus shelter. The Clerk had been trying to contact Northern Power Grid to determine there were plans to develop in or across the proposed bus shelter placement, this was an ongoing task. A request would be made of Risby homes to assist with the groundworks of this project.

RESOLVED: that the Bus Shelter funding was confirmed.

11/25/75 FINANCE

It was discussed that the Sportsfield account was now being managed by the Clerk. The monies held by the Sportsfield account was Parish Council monies and it was discussed as being beneficial to merge the bank accounts. The Sportsfield was not a separate entity to the Parish Council.

A Cllr queried whether the Sportsfield income would affect the precept request. This income was Parish Council funds. It was discussed that research be undertaken into what level of carry over the Parish council could have before the precept was affected.

Sportsfield

The LA had attended the site of the proposed Tennis Hut. According to the building regulations the Tennis Hut was believed to be exempt, this was awaited in writing. The base of the Tennis Hut was yet to be decided on. This would be a Parish Council asset with equal 50 percent contributions from the Tennis Club and the Parish Council. A Cllr asked if the bench would require moving. There was no intention to move the bench.

The lounge floor required repair. This had been quoted at an estimated cost of £100 and would be undertaken this week.

Allotments

It was noted that the following items had been raised:

- An ash tree was casting too much shadow over allotment Plot 5 and surrounding plots, allotment holders had requested that this tree be pruned or removed;
- It had been agreed to trim up the stump that had re-grown in Plot 5;
- The boundary fence required completion and repair near the top exit, Cllr Peirson would undertake this;
- It was noted that allotment holders were able to continue watering food crops during hose pipe bans;
- The main footpath was uneven and extremely slippery, It was requested that woodchip be used to level and resurface;
- A divet was starting in the carparking area external to allotments;
- There was one vacant plot, the Clerk had begun to contact villagers on the waiting list.

It was noted that the ash tree was a healthy tree. The tree was pruned, when necessary, by the power company as it was close to a cable. Cllrs would assess the car parking.

Play Park

The village had been awarded £45,000.00 commuted funds to be spent on a children's playground or sporting facilities. It was queried whether this funding could also be utilised by Risby Homes for their playground creation.

Dog Walking Field

No update to be received.

Storage

There was the possibility to place some storage containers. A quote for the building to be repaired had not yet been received.

RESOLVED: that the Village infrastructure updates be received.

11/25/77 COMMUNITY ISSUES

Pond matters

It was requested that a mirror image fountain be placed in the pond at a cost of £1450.00. Cllr requested that the electricity usage be assessed first.

There would be water lilies placed in the pond in the summer.

Quickline works

Cllr Peirson would raise the issue of the mess left from the works with Quickline.

A Cllr requested that a banner be created advertising when the Parish council meeting was held. All Cllrs were in agreement.

RESOLVED:

- a) that the pond electricity usage be assessed;
- b) that water lilies be placed in the pond in summer 2026;
- c) that the mess from the works undertaken be raised with Quickline;
- d) that a banner advertising the Parish Council meeting be purchased.
