Recently I've been reflecting on the verse above. It was a word given to Isaiah the prophet to the Jewish people who were in exile in Babylon. It is a word of hope in a stressful and exhausting place. It is a word that has resonated with me in the past and resonates with me still as my family and I embark on new adventures early in the new year. The verse also speaks of God's unending pursuit of us with his love... desperately wanting us to see His goodness and peace and joy and hope in the multitude of stresses and challenges our lives present. It was also a prophetic word about Jesus' purpose during his time on earth. In the brutality that was the Roman Empire, Jesus preached peace. When a Roman could force you to carry his pack a mile, Jesus encouraged his followers to carry it two. In a society that was very much 'an eye for an eye' Jesus preached turning the other cheek. He was counter cultural and as I read his words, I think he still is. The path to peace is not easy. It requires us to make active choices along the way. God desperately wants us to experience His peace, joy and hope but He also wants us to actively seek it. And so with that in mind, I think it's time I review my Christmas to do list.
