Finding What Is Of Value by Revd Richard

Imagine you are digging in your garden, maybe putting in a new patio or a shed, and you come across something you suspect is of immense value; maybe it is a jewel, or a box of rare coins. Can you imagine what that would feel like? What would you do?

What if one week you notice on the telly or in the paper that your lottery numbers all match the jackpot numbers? You then look for the ticket but can't find it, until finally you find it stuffed next to old receipts you had set aside for shredding. What would all that feel like?

Jesus tells a series of parables about people finding items of value that have been either lost or discovered for the first time. In each story the protagonist does all they can to find or secure the thing they value. We all invest our time and energy into the things we value the most. Jesus phrases it as, 'Your heart is where your treasure is.' Jesus is the fullness of God incarnated as fully human so that you and I may be found. He is overjoyed to find us just where and as we are because you and I are of great value to God.

Sports Pavilion Update

Parish Council Update - Real Fibre Broadband for Cherry Burton

The Parish Council understands that there are currently no plans for BT to install a fibre optics network to Cherry Burton in the foreseeable future.

Currently, the only way in which residents are likely to be able to achieve higher broadband speeds is through the KCOM fibre network "Project Gigabit" scheme.

KCOM are developing a £100M expansion plan for Hull, East Riding and some adjacent counties to upgrade houses to "Fibre to the Premises" (FTTP) by March 2022, a big improvement on current Fibre to the Cabinet (FTTC) Light Stream services. However, following recent communication with the Parish Council, it is understood that KCOM's real fibre broadband rollout in Cherry Burton is now under review.

Although some areas of the village have Light Stream a more complete upgrade could come if more demand is stimulated. This applies equally to outlying areas e.g. High Gardham, Malton Rd., York Rd. etc.

A pre-registration voucher scheme for communities is aimed at attracting this infrastructure funding, but the whole village needs to achieve a 30% minimum interest threshold (subject to Commercial review). Our Village Church History (Part 2) - St Michael & all Angels

The opening ceremony for the new church was performed by the Archbishop on 24th October 1853. The money for the building of the church was mainly raised by subscription from local land owners and it cost about £2000. The church consisted of a nave, chancel, aisle, vestry, tower and a north porch, all in the Early Decorated style. The tower houses 3 bells, (now electrically rung), and the church clock was installed there around 1880. It cost £120 and is very unusual for a village church as it has 4 faces. Apparently the local land owner wanted to be able to tell the time from wherever he happened to be. The clock strikes on the hour and quarter hours. The bottom of the tower, (at the west end of the church), originally had pews for children. These were removed after a clock weight fell from above, injuring a member of the congregation. It subsequently became the tower vestry and was screened off in 1970. In 1898 the small vestry on the south of the church was enlarged and the current organ subsequently installed there and dedicated by the Bishop of Beverley in 1899. The lychgate at the entrance to the churchyard was built in 1925, by Harry Hill of Etton.

whatever your age, with or without children!

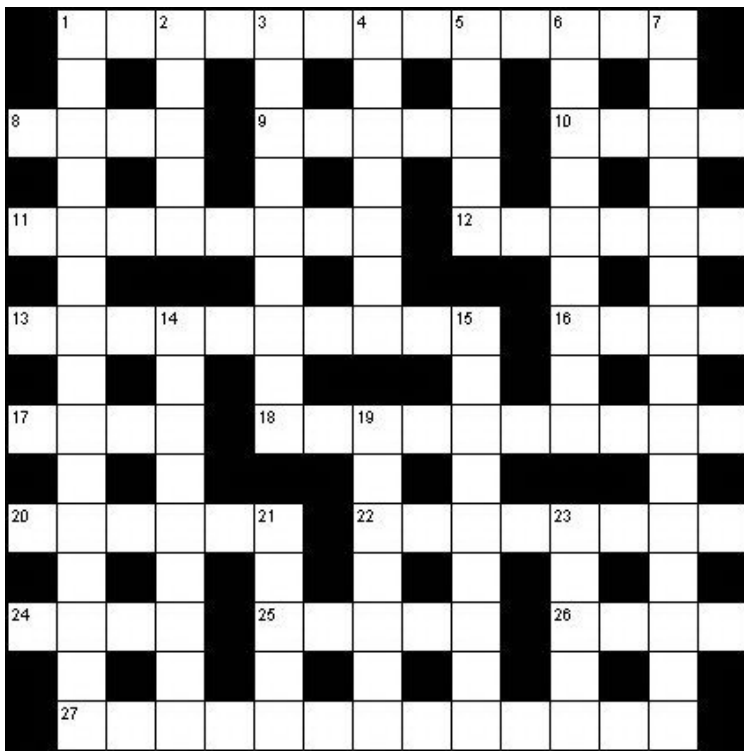
